

A NOTE FROM PASTOR JENN

Dear Church of the Saviour Family,

On March 20, at our Traditional service, we sang the hymn Trust and Obey.

As I was reading through the words of this hymn I was struck by the ending of the third verse...

What He says we will do, where He sends we will go; Never fear, only trust and obey.

I am writing this letter with full trust in my Lord and a willingness to obey the call. I have been asked to trust in my call, saying yes to Bishop Gregory V. Palmer who has appointed me to serve as the new District Superintendent of the Ohio River Valley District beginning July 1, 2022. A District Superintendent is an extension of the office of bishop, serving as the one who is to oversee the total ministry of the clergy and churches in the community of the district to which appointed. I am staying in the area but will no longer serve as Church of the Saviour's Senior Pastor, a position I have loved since 2014.

When I was ordained in 2006, I entered a covenant with all my other clergy colleagues; I will go where I am sent. I was not anticipating being "sent" anywhere this year, so I was taken back by the call from Bishop. I am humbled by the trust Bishop Palmer has in me to lead the churches and pastors of the Ohio River Valley and I will be honored to sit at the cabinet table.

My time here has been full. We have mourned together and laughed together. We have wrestled with the Word of God together finding God's vision and call for our individual lives and as a church. We have worshipped together, even stretching ourselves to be a church online, out on the front lawn and in our cars. You have all welcomed me into your family's lives and I have treasured each moment spent with you. Church of the Saviour is a church of passionate, spirit-filled, faithful followers of Jesus, and it has been a privilege to walk with you.

Please be in prayer for our Servant Leadership Board as they meet with District Superintendent Todd Anderson to reflect on the qualities desired in your next pastor. Begin to pray for your next senior pastor. The mission and ministry have not changed, and I know whoever fills the senior pastor chair next, will continue to move this church forward.

As I type these words, I am filled with many emotions. I am grateful that for the last 8 years I have been able to be your pastor and there is great sadness in saying goodbye. I will admit there is an element of fear and excitement about the new challenges ahead. Transitions can be vulnerable times in the lives of individuals and organizations. But I believe it is also a time during which God can do some of God's best work if we

will make ourselves available to whatever it is that God is up to in our midst.

I return to the hymn Trust and Obey where the first verse reads;

When we walk with the Lord in the light of His Word,
What a glory He sheds on our way!
While we do His good will,
He abides with us still,
And with all who will trust and obey.

Church of the Saviour, I know you will continue to walk with Lord doing His good will. Know that my yes to being sent out to a new appointment does not change the love I have for each of you. You will continue to be in my heart because I have been changed by my life and ministry here.

HOLY WEEK



As a congregation, our journey through Lent culminates with Holy Week. Witnessing Christ's sacrifice for those who follow Him can be emotionally difficult. Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday worship services reveal the depth of Christ's love and mercy for us. The weight of Christ's sacrifice gives way to the joy of new life through resurrection on Easter morning. Set aside other distractions and make your way to our sanctuary as we worship together (livestream is available for those unable to join us inperson).

April 10, 2022 | Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday is the Christian holiday that occurs on the Sunday before Easter. This celebration commemorates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, mentioned in each of the four Gospels.

Jesus entered the city knowing He would be tried and crucified and welcomed His fate to rise from the grave and save us from sin! Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, the remembrance of Jesus' last days to the cross.

April 14, 2022 - 7:00 pm | In Person and Online

On the Thursday before Good Friday and Easter, we observe Maundy Thursday. This day commemorates Jesus's last supper with his disciples. During that meal in the upper room, Jesus washed his disciples' feet and gave them a new commandment: "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another" (John 13:34).

Good Friday is one of the most important days in the Holy Week, which begins on Palm Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday. In short, Good Friday marks the crucifixion and dying of Christ. On this day, we reflect upon Christ's sacrifice for our sins.



March Finance report to congregation

Below is our current two-month financial status report. Church of the Saviour is off to a solid start for 2022. It is still however, very early in the year with some unknowns from inflation, potential increased benefit costs, and potential moving costs for a new pastor. The Finance Committee monitors monthly how we are tracking on income and expenses, staying prepared to alter course if necessary.

Trustees and Finance Committee have built up a reserve fund of \$210,000 for the roof replacement expected in 2023 or 24. This amount is a little more than half of the expected cost, so we have some more to do to prepare for that work. Within the Trustee budget for this year are other project provisions for ongoing needs including a sprinkler system for all the required landscaping on our west property line, and the recently completed major electrical repair to our main building. The leadership is working together to maintain our facilities.

We have been working since last June to rapidly pay down the construction loan balance while managing our cash on hand. About \$400,000 has been paid down leaving a current balance of just under \$200,000 on this, our only debt. We expect to pay off the balance over the next year. In a perfect, non-covid world, this would have been erased sooner.

Our 2020 audit was completed and the 2021 audit is underway by Flynn and Company. The West Ohio Conference requires an annual audit of churches in our size category. Our regular bookkeeping duties are handled by the Provisium Group, a non-profit focused accounting company. Our COS treasurer watches over the details to make sure all is coordinated properly.

The laughter and smiles overflowed om our Peace House meeting room as I joined the Tri-State Amputee Support Group on the 2nd Thursday of March. Around the table, each blessed person shared their joy, hope in the face of despair, and an occasional hilarious one liner. Authentic relationships leaning on one another in loving compassion and care.

I was blessed to be invited and offer a blessing to this uplifting and encouraging support group by their inspiring longtime leader, Louis Beckman. Originally formed by Richard Friend and his wife and caregiver Sandy, The Tri-State Amputee Group has been meeting for 23 years at Church of the Saviour. In March 1999, Richard was interviewed in a newspaper article as an invitation to the new support group. He shared, "You're very much on your own and you just have to make this stuff up as you go. The goal of our amputee support group is to share every day, practical information with other amputees."

What started out as a practical and simple goal has transformed into a group of both amputees and their partners sharing life's learnings, highs and lows, and new medical advancements all while shining hope and love in our community.
