A Note From Pastor Meshach



In this month's note I wanted to pass along a book recommendation. As you've probably picked up from my sermons, I love movies and I love to read. Every so often a movie or book makes such an impression on me that I feel as if it is my bounden duty to make sure others pick it up. Such was the case with The Patient Ferment of the Early Church.

In this book the author, Alan Kreider, explains how the virtue of patience, embodied in almost every action of the early church's life, placed them on a trajectory of improbable growth. In a day when the church was still very small, had no positional authority, no institutional claim, and was under constant threat of real persecution, these Christians patiently embodied the life of Christ and grew.

This kind of church growth strategy goes against most of the popular ones of our day. Ours focuses on massive activity famously known as the ABC's of church growth: Attendance, Building, and Cash! In other words, get people to come to church; have a beautiful building to welcome them into, and keep the money flowing to enable ministry of all sorts to take place. Again, not bad! It's just remarkable that the early church didn't do any of that... and yet they grew continuously for decades!

Instead of making it easy for people to become members of their Christian communities, new prospects were patiently taken through months of catechesis, where they would learn how to "put on Christ" in word and deed. Their focus was almost entirely on teaching members of their community how to "walk the talk."

This concept was clearly communicated through the extant writings of Bishop Cyprian of North Africa: "Beloved brethren, we

are philosophers not in words but in deeds; we exhibit our wisdom not by our dress, but by truth; we know virtues by their practice rather than through boasting of them; we do not speak great things but we live them."

They believed that by patiently embodying the way of Jesus in their community, even while being mauled by wild animals in the spectacle of the Coliseum, God would bring the desired results. Or, as Jesus himself said, "If I be lifted up I will draw all people to me" (John 12:32). They lifted Christ up through their patient observation of his teachings, and Christ added to their number those who were being saved.

Obviously as a pastor I am very intrigued by the history of the early church. Because not only did they grow numerically but, most importantly, they grew qualitatively. They were large Christians who, even though small in number, made a tremendous impact in their world.


This is what I want for God's church today, particularly those saints as Church of the Saviour. The question, then, is How can the virtue of patience form us as it formed them? And, are there any ways we are embodying and being formed by impatient practices? In other words, is hurry trying to join us in our processes in any area?

I don't have the answers to these questions, but I am interested in patiently seeking them out. And, I encourage you to read the book, too. Perhaps God will give you insights that will benefit us all. If you do read it, please drop me an email and tell me what you think about it.

A Note about Door Security:

Dear members and guests of Church of the Saviour (COS):

Representatives from the Montgomery Nursery School (MNS) and Servant Leadership Boards (SLB) met to discuss the best way to ensure that our building remains safe and accessible during the current preschool year. Below is the new policy that we will be using to enable continued usage of COS space, and promote safety for the preschool and everyone using our facilities.

For the remainder of the MNS school year all exterior doors will be locked from 9AM - 3PM, Monday — Friday. If you need access to the building during these time please utilize the intercom system and a church staff member will grant access. If you have a regularly scheduled group meeting, we ask that you would create a rotation where one group member stands at the door to give your group members access until your meeting begins. Please do not prop open any doors.

Additionally, if you're in the Sanctuary portion of the building and you need to get to the church office space, we ask that you would use one of these options:

Exit the building and walk around to the entrance by the main office. This helps our preschool teachers who are trying to keep their classroom spaces safe and they may not recognize everyone from the church. Call the church office and a staff member can come and meet you.

Church office hours are Monday — Thursday, 9AM — 3:30PM, and Fridays by appointment only. Doors will unlock as required for evening and weekend activities.

Karen Crawford was born and raised in Pontiac, Michigan. She is the youngest of three, with two older brothers. Karen was raised in the United Methodist Church, but never dreamed as a child that God would call her to pastor a church. She had her call to ministry at the age of 17, when she was involved in an All-Terrain Vehicle accident that put her in a coma for three days. There, she had a journey with the Lord where He called her to shepherd His flock. She received her B.A. in religion and pre-theology at Ohio Wesleyan University, where she met her husband, Andy.

Karen attended seminary at United Theological Seminary, in Dayton, OH. Soon after receiving her Masters of Divinity, she was married and received her first church. Karen was called as Senior Pastor to the 2-point charge of Cedar Hill Calvary and Hoy Memorial UMCs, in Fairfield County.

Two years later, she was ordained a Deacon and appointed as the Associate Pastor to Grove City UMC, where she spent four years before being called to Delta, Ohio, to be nearer to her mother, who was succumbing to cancer.

While at Delta, Karen received her Doctor of Ministry degree from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. Her DMin is in Parish Ministry, with emphasis in Spiritual Formation.

After seven years, Karen was asked to be an associate a second time, this time to Scioto Ridge UMC in Hilliard, a church very similar to Church of the Saviour.

Karen spent nine years in southeast Ohio, serving as Senior Pastor just two miles south of the Ohio University campus, in Athens. She was blessed to have many professors and administrators from OU in the parish, which provided the church wirh a great variety of gifts and ministries.

For the past three years, Karen has been serving First UMC in Mt. Sterling, the small village where Andy grew up, so that they could help provide care to Andy's ailing father.

Karen is currently in her 28th year of pastoral ministry, but she has also served as a drop-in center coordinator, worked within the Delaware County juvenile court system, and has been a christian education director and youth pastor in three separate churches during her years in the college and seminary. This gives her a little over 31 years of active ministry under her belt.

Andy has held a variety of interesting occupations as he and Karen have moved around Ohio, but he can most consistently be found coaching high school sports - 33 years total; the last 20 in cross country and track & field - and in writing syndicated sports columns. Andy is also actively involved in community theatre, having performed in over three dozen shows over the past 25 years.

Andy and Karen just celebrated their 28th year of marriage on October 15th. They have no children but have owned a variety of pet rabbits over the years. There is currently one fur baby, a sable colored female named Aurora,

One quirky thing about Andy and Karen is that they are addicted to Disney. They take nearly all of their vacations to Orlando, but they also love Disney movies and stage plays, and they even took a Disney cruise for their 25th Anniversary.



This empirically supported social-emotional learning curriculum teaches children prosocial behaviors in a concrete way that is understandable to children as young as three years old. Emotion identification, emotion expression, and interaction with others are some of the concepts emphasized throughout the PATHS program. By being at Montgomery Nursery School on a regular basis, Dr. Sweeney is also able to offer support to teachers and families who are struggling with how to support children who exhibit challenging behaviors.

Jill Waldon, Director of MNS, has this to say about PATHS: "It has really helped children develop their social skills, which many are lacking due the pandemic. The PATHS 'Turtle Strategy' for dealing with big feelings has made all the different in changing undesirable behaviors in the classroom. The technique is modelled by the teachers on a daily basis. This makes for a positive learning environment that children feel safe, secure, and loved.
