RETURN OF THE CIRCUIT RIDER

We are excited to send to you our first revised version of the Circuit Rider. What is the Circuit Rider? For Church of the Saviour, it is our monthly newsletter where we can share more in depth articles, information and pictures with our growing congregation. The Circuit Rider is to help you connect and be aware of all the ministries happening within the life of the church.

Circuit Rider, is a phrase connected to our history as Methodists. In the early days of the Methodist movement, a circuit was made up of two or more local churches (sometimes referred to as societies). In American Methodism, circuits were sometimes referred to as a "charge." A pastor would be appointed to the charge by his bishop. During the course of a year, the pastor was expected to visit each church on the charge at least once, and possibly start some new ones. The traveling preachers responsible for caring for these societies, or local churches and stations, became known as circuitriders.

We welcome back our Circuit Rider Monthly Newsletter, one of our many ways of caring for, sharing information, and getting out the mission of Church of the Saviour.

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A NOTE FROM PASTOR JENN

Greetings Church!

Happy Spring – a season of renewal! "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." – 2 Corinthians 5:17 (ESV)

Was anybody else counting the days until spring? After a year of the COVID-19 Pandemic, I know I was. Though the cool, crisp days of Fall are my favorite time of year, Spring would be a close second! There's just something about the freshness and renewal of Spring that should be a natural encouragement to each of us.

Just as we have been anticipating spring and the changes and new life it will bring, our Servant Leadership Board has been anticipating the exciting changes this year will bring. We began our year with goals being set to guide us in the year ahead. Our number one goal is to increase an understanding/practice of discipleship. Before COVID, we had a discipleship pathway that involved worship on Sunday mornings, Sunday school on Sunday mornings, and opportunities to serve, study or lead throughout the week, all within our building on Pfeiffer Road. COVID has given us new opportunity to expand our physical community, into a growing online community. Our website and social media platforms can no longer be used solely to drive people to our physical building, but rather we can use these platforms for worship, small groups, discussions, learning opportunities and connections. At its best, the social media world can help build relationships, and we have a goal to continue to increase our use of social media in an intentional way and stay connected with our new, and existing, church family.

Another example of increasing an understanding/practice of discipleship is to develop new leadership and small group options. This summer we plan to have Leadership Development Training for our fall groups to discuss new styles of meeting. We have tested and seen success with groups that are a hybrid of in-person and online, which allows for multiple ways to connect and grow as a disciple in this ever-changing landscape.

Outreach and advocacy are other ways to increase our understanding/practice of discipleship. We have amazing Mission Partners, and we want to increase our ministry with these partnerships! As we continue to move through this year, discussion groups, and Listen and Learn opportunities will be developed in order to be part of the conversation with the many needs within our church, community and world. These discussions can include, but are not limited to: talking about the increase in mental health needs as a result of this pandemic; conversations and advocacy on the issue of racism; and issues within the church when it comes to the divide in our denomination. The goal is to keep conversations going as we continue to grow in our walk with Christ and each other.

Our Servant Leadership Board has taken on a challenge, a shift in focus, in order to be part of the conversation. We have dedicated

ourselves to the study of two books: *Holy Love: A Biblical Theology for Human Sexuality* by Steve Harper and *The Color of Compromise: The Truth about the American Church's Complicity in Racism* by Jemar Tisby. These two books were chosen because conversations need to continue with the pending split within our denomination over whether or not we allow the ordination of LGBTQ pastors or allow same-sex marriage and the continued unrest within our churches and culture when it comes to race. Having courageous conversations is not easy, but as a board we are committing to them so we can extend and/or join in with conversations that are happening within our church and community.

Please pray for our staff, board, and pastors as we all commit to creating environments that only encourage growth for all in their walk with Christ.

Holy Week is this week! Our Holy Week will include Maundy Thursday and Good Friday Worship Services. You will be able to participate either in person

A new ministry is coming to Church of the Saviour called Helping Hands. Helping Hands connects those who need help with those who can help. It's that simple.

If you or someone you know has a need, communicate this need through our Helping Hands page on our church website. It will be received confidentially by church staff and we will establish a way for you to receive help.

In some instances, we will identify needs that can be fulfilled by people within our church community. These needs will be posted on the Helping Hands page of our church website where you can sign-up to volunteer to help. In order to protect the person receiving help, the need will remain anonymous until the connection is made to the person providing help.

Examples of these needs are:

- A meal train sign-up
- Someone to run errands such as shopping
- Help with technology such as how to use Zoom

Some needs are better fulfilled by a service team. These service teams will be organized through a church-wide monthly service day called "Service Saturday". - Yardwork
- Changing lightbulbs or fire alarm batteries
- Simple home repairs
- Painting

What Do I Do? Affordable Housing



"Pastor, what do I do?" she desperately asked me over the phone.

She called from a nearby motel lobby. She was out of money. Her new job didn't pay until next week. A month ago, she

was just getting by until her landlord raised her rent and her work hours were cut back. Now, she was trying to live in a nearby motel to avoid sleeping in her car.

"Pastor, what do I do?" Her question shook my mind, heart, and faith. She did not need a gas card or a food pantry. Her immediate need was money for one more motel night, but the uncertainty would haunt her again in the morning. She needed affordable housing to get back on her feet.

"Lord, what do I do?" As I prayed, Jesus led me to the root of the problem. There is a lack of affordable housing. Take one look at the prices of available housing and rental market in Cincinnati and you can't deny it. Ask any local pastor and they will tell you the calls due to lack of affordable and sustainable housing has increased. Recently, the Metropolitan Area Religious Coalition of Cincinnati (MARCC) asked *"Lord, what can we do?"*

MARCC brought the real need for housing to Cincinnati voters through the special Affordable Housing Amendment on the ballot for May 4 election. Our own Ohio River Valley District occupies a seat at the MARRC table along with one representative from each major Christian church, Jewish Synagogue and the Cincinnati Islamic Center. More information is available <u>online here.</u>

Our brothers and sisters in faith and our ORV District leaders are advocating for sustainable change and affordable housing for all people in Cincinnati. It is not a perfect solution and there will be details to debate. But are we willing to answer God's call and face the brave question, *"Lord, what can we do together?"*

Affordable housing is both an issue of economic and racial justice. Church of the Saviour will continue to offer important studies to fight racism. We also are finding ways move to action and advocacy in our community and our church. REGENERATING THE CHORAL MINISTRY



Voices United in Song Returns to Church of the Saviour

We are underway with efforts to regenerate the choral program Church of the Saviour. Although we continue with certain constraints to maintain a safe environment, the arrival of the Covid vaccine and ongoing research and practices regarding singing brings about the time to rebuild our choirs. The trustees and our HVAC company have conducted tests that produced measurements and data with air refresh rates in the sanctuary and fellowship hall. We now know the appropriate duration to be singing in one space before moving to the other.

We are also using another exciting resource from the International Coalition of Performing Arts Aerosol Study. Their six-month study resulted in three reports generating an extensive amount of findings and recommendations that allow musicians utilizing wind for sound production to safely resume rehearsing. The document has been extremely helpful in designing protocols for us to resume singing. One of the predominant mitigating factors that all of us learned in the last year is wearing a mask. They are a proven source in prohibiting the spread of the virus. We received a COS Endowment Grant to supply all of our singers with the Livinguard mask that gives greater protection than basic masks and benefits singers in limited rehearsals.

Many of our regular singers have or will soon return to rehearsals and worship services. Now is a great time for people interested in joining a choir to get on board. The choirs are working on rebuilding singing skills and technique. Learning together and making harmony get straight to the heart of our work as worship leaders. 
will admit to being one). There is no membership – you are invited to come whenever and to whatever tickles your interest or imagination – and it's a great way to meet other Church of the Saviour folks.
