Our YTD income is \$663,183.44, YTD expenses are \$670,159.43. The YTD operating deficit is \$6,976.99 which is 1.05% of our income. Although our income is under expectations, our expenses are under budget and not dramatically over running our income. The bottom line is that we have been managing our organization with a careful eye on both the budget and the actual income.

Included in June's expenses are several charges that hit once a year (\$2,000 for IT Software & support, \$2,100 for annual security monitoring, \$8,000 for the annual audit), the completion of a large Trustee project (\$13,500 for the sprinkler system, and a major repair item (\$3,000 for office HVAC repair). In June, annual events related expenses also hit the books for the youth choir trip, youth mission trip, and VBS. Some of the choir and mission trip expenses still need to be moved from the general budget to specific Designated Accounts. Once we get past the end of July, any outstanding additional expenses for these three events will be paid and will not recur until Summer 2023. In addition, expenses that should be paid for from Designated Accounts will also be moved from the General Budget to the specific Designated accounts.

In summary, June revenue was lower than YTD average and expenses were higher mostly due to some one-time occurrences. Finance committee is guardedly optimistic that we will be within budget on expenses and revenue will be on target for a solid year. Thank you for your continued stewardship so C O S can reach and exceed its ministry goals.

Stephen Minister Interview with Mark Hoover

1. Did you have concerns or expectations when you chose to become a Stephen Minister?

I had contemplated becoming a Stephen Minister (SM) for many years, but with a busy work schedule and three kids at home, it never seemed like the right time.

However, three years before my planned retirement, I was asked to change jobs and come to work for a long-time friend. For the first time in a very long time, work travel and overtime work disappeared. It was like God was clearing my plate of excuses for not joining Stephen Ministry. I felt God had paved the way for me to make this commitment. I later found out it was to be one of the best decisions I have made.

2. What did you think was useful or valuable to you from your Stephen Minister training?

Two things stood out in my mind as being valuable assets that I acquired during Stephen Ministry training.

First, at the beginning of our class, the regular person who conducted all training was unavailable. Therefore, the Stephen Minister group shared the task of conducting SM classes by employing several active SM's.

This change brought a wide range of experience and ideas as to how to handle various situations to the table. By the end of the training course, almost every class member mentioned the use of multiple class instructors was a valuable part of learning how to become a good SM care giver.

Second, an important skill everyone in the class acquired was how to pray for your Care Receiver. I was initially not good at this and would avoid requests to do this in class.

When we got to the section of class on praying for others, both my partner and I had a real discomfort with doing this. In future classes my class partner and I took turns asking about how the other person's week had gone, and from this information, I learned how to pray for my partner and the challenges or the achievements she was experiencing.

By the time our training sessions had ended, my SM partner and I were much more comfortable with praying for others.

Like many things in life, you can be anxious about how to deal with new things at first. I learned that putting together a plan can often relieve that anxiousness and allowed me to move forward.

3. Why is being a Stephen Minister important to you?

By being a SM, we are fulfilling God's commandment to love others as you love yourself. By doing this, I often find that I get as much out of this work as those I care for.

4. What talents or spiritual gifts do you think are important for a Stephen Minister?

Here are my thoughts:

- A. Caring for others.
- B. Having empathy for others
- C. Listening to others
- D. Life experiences that you have had to help you understand how others might feel when facing a life challenge. Mine included having been there for both my grandmother's, my brother, and both my parents when they died; having been through a divorce and having been laid off once from work.

Every summer, United Women in Faith offers engaging and transformational educational experiences at a yearly event called Mission U. The experience centers around an enriching curriculum which is designed to inform and inspire. It offers us an opportunity to grow spiritually, become more deeply rooted in Christ and motivates us to put faith into action. This year the 2022 Mission U titled "Who Can We Be Together?" was a biblical exploration of Luke 13.

In July, I had the privilege of attending Mission U, a virtual event hosted by the West Ohio Conference United Women in Faith. It was my first-time attending Mission U, and I did not know what to expect. Over the course of four evenings, in a group of approximately 25 members of United Women in Faith from various towns in Ohio, (including both women and men!), we took a deep dive into Luke 13.

Each session (8 in all, each 1 hour) included 3 readings from different bible versions (NRSV, NIV, The Message, etc.) of the same short passage in Luke 13. This was followed by whole group reflection, small group reflection, individual reflection, and tapestry thoughts (5 minutes of journaling through words and/or drawings of our key learnings and personal contemplations). The goal for participants was to listen and contribute to discussion rather than worrying about "saying the right thing." Interspersed during the study were music, poetry, and prayer to augment the immersive educational experience. Additionally, no homework was necessary, just your attentive presence.

Lessons from Luke 13 such as Jesus' command "to repent or perish," the parable of the fig tree, the act of healing on the sabbath, the metaphor of the narrow door and more showed us what it means to be a **community**. A community is defined as unified body of individuals that have common interests, goals, geographic boundaries, activities, or circumstances. At Mission U, we developed an even broader understanding of community. We discussed how Jesus, and therefore how we, should see, include, and lift-up those in our community who are marginalized. We learned about

faith

action

sisterhood

ableism (social prejudice against people with disabilities rooted in the assumption that disabled individuals require fixing), **advocacy**, **kingdom** (an inclusive term for God's community), **justice** and **repentance** (turning away from sin and *toward God*). In our study we witnessed Jesus' determination and persistence as he leads the people and his boldness as he challenges societal constructs. And throughout Luke 13 hope shines!

Mission U provided a contemplative, worthwhile way to read sacred scripture. I thoroughly enjoyed Mission U and would highly recommend this to anyone! This biblical class was efficient in that we unpacked so much meaning out of Luke 13, and effective in that we reflected key aspects within our own lives and situations.
