Notes:

- •November is the first month this year where COS had a Year -to-Date Net Operating Loss. It is small and we expect to finish the year with a small surplus.
- •November's giving was higher that the previous three months, but still below the budget's expectations.
- •November's expenses were approximately \$19,000 more than November's income, but about \$10,000 less than November's budget.
- •Staff Parish Relations Committee expenses were ~\$16,000 over budget in November, but \$19,000 under budget for the year to date.

Yearend Finance Committee wrap up:

Covid has offered most organizations a challenging time and COS is not an exception. Our expenses year to date at the end of November are about \$8,000 over revenue. Over the months of Covid our attendance and revenue have certainly taken a hit. The good news is that we seem to be recovering. We expect that December revenue will erase our relatively small deficit year to date.

Our projected Pledge income for 2022 has improved and stands right now at \$1,029,000, which is higher than the last several years. We are projecting our non-pledged giving to exceed 2021 as well. These projections allow us to provide a 3% pay increase for our dedicated staff, which we felt was at least an attempt to recognize their efforts and to help them defray the inflation increases we are experiencing. Also built into the 2022 budget is a substantial increase in utility costs. Other budget areas have remained at 2021 levels or below.

The only debt Church of the Saviour has is the remainder of the construction loan on the Peace House and parking lot projects. During 2021 approximately \$200,000 was paid down leaving a balance of less than \$400,000. We anticipate that we will be able to make a principal payment of more than \$100,000 in January. Finance Committee will finalize a plan to deal with the remainder of the construction loan in January as we evaluate our year end cash balances. Early next year the Finance Committee will provide a full accounting of the Peace House project and capital campaign.

The annual audit by Flynn and Company is nearly complete. They are waiting clarification of some final invoices on the Peace House which should close the books on the audit.

In conclusion, Church of the Saviour is blessed by the financial support and efforts of the congregation to maintain this vital community ministry. Many churches envy what we have accomplished. The burden is on all of us to continue to grow the good work as we enthusiastically approach 2022.

members of our congregation as a symbol of the investment our church family is making to partner & walk alongside parents during this journey.



IN OUR OWN VOICE | Sunday, January 9 at 7:00 pm at COS Sanctuary

Church of the Saviour's **Peace House Ministries** mission is to model Christ by cultivating and being a brave community to promote mental health, wellness, and purpose for all people. To cultivate a brave space this January, Peace House Ministries will host NAMI *In Our Own Voice* presentation. This presentation changes attitudes, assumptions, and stereotypes about people with mental health conditions. The presentation combines a video in three parts along with two NAMI trained presenters who talk about their mental health journey. It provides a personal perspective of mental illness, as presenters with lived experience talk openly about what it's like to live with a mental health condition.

Our presenters humanize the misunderstood, highly stigmatized topic of mental illness by showing that it's possible—and common—to live well with a mental health condition.

This presentation also provides:

A chance to ask presenters questions, allowing for a deeper understanding of mental health conditions and dispelling of stereotypes and misconceptions.

The understanding that every person with a mental health condition can hope for a brighter future. Information on how to learn more about mental health and get involved with the mental health community.

Peace House Ministries and NAMI have specifically invited speakers that can address in a personal way to the challenges after the holidays and the impact of the pandemic on our mental health. The pandemic and other society stressors have created increased anxiety and depression especially for both the elderly and young adults in our community. Parents are supporting their children through this as well as dealing with the failing health of their parents. Presenters who have firsthand experience with these issues will share their journey, connections to their faith, and coping skills that work.

'In Our Own Voice' is a NAMI signature presentation and has been presented to faith communities, businesses, university classes (Medical School, Psychology, Occupational Therapy programs, Nursing Social Work, as well as clubs), CIT training to first responders and at the Cincinnati Division FBI. Our presentations have been very well received in every setting.




