

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MESHACH



Greetings!

Last month I wrote about a book called *The Patient*Ferment of the Early

Church, written by Church historian Alan Kreider.

Guess what? I still have a lot to say about it! It will certainly show up in a few sermons down the road, but I want to use some of this article to share one of

the most impactful parts of it.

There is a word Kreider uses repeatedly in the book that is of the utmost importance to understanding how the early church grew; that word is Habitus. Habitus is an old Latin word that refers to a way of gaining knowledge through your body as opposed to your brain. Kreider defines it as "a system of dispositions that we carry in our bodies... [It] is formed by repetition, by the sheer physicality of doing things over and over so that they become habitual, reflexive, and borne in our bodies."

The early church didn't focus on growing numerically, they focused on growing the people that were part of the faith community. They wanted Christians with large lives more than they wanted many Christians. Since qualitative growth was their aim, they developed a habitus that would train disciples, not merely to know about Jesus but, to have Christian reflexes.

I hope that last sentence is as stunning to you as it was to me. To train a person to react without thinking means forming the mind, but also the finger tips and the toes; for there is knowledge throughout our body, not just our brains. We all know this to be true. How many of you have remembered your password only once you sat down and put your fingers to the keyboard. Things like this happen all the time. Our bodily reflexes kick in and we respond before we can think.

Unfortunately much of our corporeal (bodily) knowledge has been shaped by the habitus of the world. The early church understood this. Therefore, they made a habitus that would not only teach disciples that Jesus said, "Bless those that curse you," but they would also teach them how to do it, to the point were eventually they were doing it automatically.

This may seem remarkable, but it's actually a common way of forming people. In fact, intentionally or unintentionally, each of us has been formed by a habitus. An example of an intentional habitus is how we teach our children to respect others through the habitus of table manners. Part of sitting up straight, politely requesting that someone pass the food instead of reaching over them, is teaching

your children how to honor and respect the people around you. The knowledge goes through their bodies to their brains.

As stated earlier, we've also been victims of a worldly habitus without knowing it. Think of brilliant marketing schemes that form us to be consumers. Consider the layout at the mall or grocery store that encourage us to buy certain things by walking a certain route. They don't have to say, "buy this candy." That would be going through the brain were reason and logic might disrupt. The greater path for success is to carry the body along a path that would cultivate a desire to consume — a habitus. So they carefully place ads that you see and hear in the right places. Products are intentional placed to be at eyesight. Then, right when we think we've beat the machine the peanut M&M's that we said we wouldn't get are right at the check-out line. A line that happens to be moving slowly, slowly tempting you to just get some this time. Annund the habitus of Kroger wins again.

If you sensed an autobiographical tone to that last paragraph you are very discerning.

All of this has me wondering... What is our habitus? To be sure, we have one; is it forming us in Christlike ways? Is it training our reflexes so that we respond as Christ would? See, the reason Jesus was able to reflexively bless those who were cursing him while hanging from the cross was because of a Kingdom habitus that shaped his entire life. Shouldn't churches aim at doing the same for those who come through our doors? I think so.

Are you interested in having your reflexes trained for Christlikeness? I know I am. I better understand what Paul meant when he wrote, "I travail again until that Christ shall have been formed in you [and me!]" (Galatians 4:19).

You have my promise that we will take a look at our habitus and ensure that, with God's help, we are practicing the things that will make us more like our big brother Jesus.

Oh yeah, and a happy Advent and Christmas season to you!

Each year I try to grow my Christmas playlist, so next time you see me please share your absolute favorite Christmas song with me.

Karen Crawford was born and raised in Pontiac, Michigan. She is the youngest of three, with two older brothers. Karen was raised in the United Methodist Church, but never dreamed as a child that God would call her to pastor a church. She had her call to ministry at the age of 17, when she was involved in an All-Terrain Vehicle accident that put her in a coma for three days. There, she had a journey with the Lord where He called her to shepherd His flock. She received her B.A. in religion and pre-theology at Ohio Wesleyan University, where she met her husband, Andy.

Karen attended seminary at United Theological Seminary, in Dayton, OH. Soon after receiving her Masters of Divinity, she was married and received her first church. Karen was called as Senior Pastor to the 2-point charge of Cedar Hill Calvary and Hoy Memorial UMCs, in Fairfield County.

Two years later, she was ordained a Deacon and appointed as the Associate Pastor to Grove City UMC, where she spent four years before being called to Delta, Ohio, to be nearer to her mother, who was succumbing to cancer.

While at Delta, Karen received her Doctor of Ministry degree from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. Her DMin is in Parish Ministry, with emphasis in Spiritual Formation.

After seven years, Karen was asked to be an associate a second time, this time to Scioto Ridge UMC in Hilliard, a church very similar to Church of the Saviour.

Karen spent nine years in southeast Ohio, serving as Senior Pastor just two miles south of the Ohio University campus, in Athens. She was blessed to have many professors and administrators from OU in the parish, which provided the church wirh a great variety of gifts and ministries.

For the past three years, Karen has been serving First UMC in Mt. Sterling, the small village where Andy grew up, so that they could help provide care to Andy's ailing father.

Karen is currently in her 28th year of pastoral ministry, but she has also served as a drop-in center coordinator, worked within the Delaware County juvenile court system, and has been a christian education director and youth pastor in three separate churches during her years in the college and seminary. This gives her a little over 31 years of active ministry under her belt.

Andy has held a variety of interesting occupations as he and Karen have moved around Ohio, but he can most consistently be found coaching high school sports - 33 years total; the last 20 in cross country and track & field - and in writing syndicated sports columns. Andy is also actively involved in community theatre, having performed in over three dozen shows over the past 25 years.

Andy and Karen just celebrated their 28th year of marriage on October 15th. They have no children but have owned a variety of pet rabbits over the years. There is currently one fur baby, a sable colored female named Aurora,

One quirky thing about Andy and Karen is that they are addicted to Disney. They take nearly all of their vacations to Orlando, but they also love Disney movies and stage plays, and they even took a Disney cruise for their 25th Anniversary.

Karen is excited to be coming onto staff at Church of the Saviour. She cannot wait to meet with small groups, to get to visit with people, to preach as Pastor Meshach needs her to, and just to be an asset to both Pastor Meshach and the congregation.



God Is At Work In Haiti!

Servants In Fellowship (SIF) has been the NGO which Church of the Saviour has partnered with for over 17 years to provide Christian ministry in Haiti. From 1999 to 2020 COS sent yearly teams of missionaries to construct a health care clinic, provide short term medical care clinics, build a school (Faith Academy), build a church, build the first HOPE orphanage in 2005, repair damage from the 2010 earthquake to our buildings, build a new HOPE orphanage in 2011 and build hundreds of small homes for people living in tents since the earthquake. SIF continues to support spreading the Gospel through our Community Development coordinator Junior Cineas and support the education, spiritual development and daily nutrition for over 450 children every year at Faith Academy, with Fanfan Janvier as director.

Due to the increasing gang violence in Haiti, SIF has not sent missionary teams to Haiti since 2020. Our in-country missionaries, Greg and Cathie Benson, retired in 2021. The current missionary family, Travis and Erin Brubaker and their 4 children, returned from Haiti permanently and will resign from SIF effective January 1, 2023. This leaves Junior and Fanfan as the current in-country SIF staff. The SIF Board of Directors has been revisioning how the organization will continue, given the change in circumstances.

Through this season of fear and change, God revealed His plan to us. The oldest girls of HOPE Orphanage decided to leave the center and reached out to Tim and Toby Banks, their previous directors and in their minds, Mom and Dad, for help. Raising Hope Ministries (RHM) was established as an 501c3 organization to support the ongoing education and career aspirations of the former HOPE girls and other Haitian students. See www.raisinghopeministries.org for further information and pictures! SIF and RHM have established a partnership to further both organization's formal goals. We share a common origin, beginning in 2005. SIF built the HOPE Center and the Banks served as the first directors, and parents, to the 20 orpaned girls who called it home. In 2012, the buildings (clinic, orphange and guest house) were illegally taken over by a Haitian national who had power through a corrupt system. All involved were griefstricken at the sudden loss of contact with Our Girls. SIF continued to serve in Haiti by building small homes and other programs. Fast forward to 2021 and the beginning of the legal exodus of the oldest HOPE Girls. It is a natural evolution and testimony to God's unending love and ability to overcome manmade obstacles to His plans.

A summary of the history of Church of the Saviour's involvement in Haiti:

1999--- First trip by a team of COS missionaries to Haiti. The relationship begins! Large and small teams from COS go to Haiti every year, except 2004, until 2021.

2000 --- Vision of an orphanage to care for Haitian girls is born.

2001---Construction of HOPE Center for Orphaned Girls begins.

2005---Tim and Toby Banks are hired as Directors of HOPE. First 5 girls arrive.

2006-2008---Next 15 girls arrive, reaching our goal of 20. Education of mind and spirit flourishes.

2010---Devastating earthquake rocks entire country. HOPE Center sustains major damage but no injuries or lives lost at HOPE.

2011---New HOPE home is built.

2012---Eviction of all missionaries from organization's properties. New organization, Servants In Fellowship (SIF) established.

2014---Georgianna UMC, FL takes over financial and administrative duties of HOPE.

2021---Oldest girls leave the orphanage and reconnect with Banks. Haiti gang violence rampant. SIF missionaries, Travis and Erin Brubaker, leave for US and briefly return to Haiti. COVID and US State Dept. Level 4 emergence warnings prohibit teams going to Haiti. 2022---Raising Hope Ministries (RHM) established. Brubakers resign from SIF due to violence in-country and educational needs of their children

---SIF work continues with Haitian team members, Junior Cineas leading Community Development and Evangelism and Fan-Fan Janvier directing Faith Academy.

---Formal partnership of SIF and RHM is established.

As you read the above chronological summary, you hopefully have a sense of God's unending work in Haiti. He never abandoned the HOPE girls, our Haitian missionaries and supporters or the work to bring God's love to His people of Haiti. Those of us who have been involved with Haitian ministries for over 20 years have a sense that the collaboration of SIF and RHM completes a God-driven circle. Care for these orphans was a dream, then reality, then sense of loss after the eviction and take-over, and now we can be intimately involved again. Church of the Saviour's Christmas Eve special offering has been designated once again to support our Haitian ministry

partners. As described above, the partnership has expanded to include Raising Hope Ministries, in addition to Servants In Fellowship and Faith Academy. 
